What hazard have you identified? What are the risks from it?	Who is at risk?	How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed? How will they be communicated to young people and adults?	Review & revise. What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
<p>A hazard is something that may cause harm or damage.</p> <p>The risk is the harm that may occur from the hazard.</p>	For example: young people, adult volunteers, visitors	<p>Controls are ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk from it.</p> <p>For example, you may use a different piece of equipment, or you might change the way you do the activity.</p>	<p>Keep checking throughout the activity in case you need to change what you're doing or even stop the activity.</p> <p>add comments which will be used as part of the review.</p>
Allergies + Food Safety	All	<p>Check allergy information and check with all participants before offering activity</p> <p>If in any doubt do not offer.</p> <p>Ensure hands and ingredients are clean before use.</p> <p>Ensure there are no food related items which will be against any religions or beliefs.</p> <p>Use separate utensils per person (straws and plastic cups)</p> <p>Ensure the leaders running stand are aware of first aid procedures if there is an allergic reaction</p>	
Equipment safety	All	<p>Ensure all items are new which will be ingested,</p> <p>Ensure new straws and cups are used.</p> <p>Instruct and guide scouts on proper use of equipment.</p>	
Slips, trips and falls	All	<p>Inspect the floor and areas in the vicinity clean areas as incidents prop up.</p> <p>Ensure appropriate foot ware is kept .</p>
